## Message from GIHR Executive Director:

We were following with great concern, the events of the Arab popular movements calling for freedom, equity, justice and human rights for all. We were also proud watching a lot of activists, who have been trained with us over the years in the Institute, making the future of their countries, and contributing to the development of tomorrow, based on the principles and spirit of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and all international conventions in this field. We were, at the same time, suffering and mourning in solidarity, working by all means to stop the bloodshed witnessed in several Arab countries thus encouraging all parties to adhere to the international obligations under human rights conventions and encouraging as well, a spirit of tolerance, brotherhood and non-violence trying to establish principles of transitional justice.

2011 was indeed a historic and a pivotal year not seen before in the human past. People around the world exercised their right to freedom of opinion and expression and peaceful assembly. But the credit goes to the Arab peoples, who were a beacon inspiring the peoples of the world how to claim human rights based on justice, equity, equality and breaking the Arab stereotypes that was wrong in the minds of the West about them, whether as a race or as people who do not respect human rights.

In this year, Geneva Institute for Human Rights (GIHR) was running its activities, but the difficulties and challenges were greater with the increasing suppression of several governments to their people, and with the increasing spate of attacks and distortion, which affected the concepts of human rights as well as the workers and activists in the field. But the patience of Intifada people, their insistence to get their legitimate rights by all peaceful means, has inspired the staff working in the Institute and made them insist more and more in finding all ways and build all possible partnerships to help meet the needs of the Arab societies in the field of education and training in human rights particularly with regard to how to effectively use the mechanisms of international protection of human rights.

In 2011, we worked in eight Arab countries from the East to the west of the Arab region: in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt, Sudan, Libya, Tunisia and Morocco. Our activities in Lebanon, Tunisia and Libya were new horizons opened for us throughout this year. Working in Libya, Tunisia and Egypt was

a special experience after the revolutions witnessed there. We conducted training in Egypt, in the Institute of the Arab Research and Studies, and in the University of Beni Suef for young activists who played a role in the Egyptian revolution. In Libya, we had the honor to train civil society activists on the basics of human rights, while in Tunisia, we also conducted training session on the Universal Periodic Review mechanism (UPR) for all stakeholders, governmental and non governmental bodies in addition to the United Nations country team.

The strategy of the work of GHR in 2011 focused on the education and guidance on human rights, where we were concerned about training the students and professors of universities and colleges in several Arab countries, in addition to our interest in teaching human rights in universities by organizing a first local seminar on “Teaching human rights in universities of Jordan” and “a national dialogue on the reality and prospects for teaching human rights in Morocco”. These activities come within the framework of the United Nations interest in training and education in the field of human rights and the adoption of the General Assembly of the Declaration on this issue in November 2011.

In 2011, we had our first experience in the field of human rights and the Cinema by producing two short feature films, the first “suspended” deals with sexual violence against women while the second, “out of the alphabet” deals with violence and discrimination against children. Coinciding with this, we launched our Arabic website, three entries on the subjects, the first, “manual on the Cinema of human rights” including a summary of more than (122), work of a film. The second, “Arts and human rights” deals with follow up of news of various arts in human rights specially in the Arab region, the third “short videos of human rights” include some of the most important short videos which are used in awareness campaigns on human rights issues in various parts of the globe.

My sincere thanks and appreciation go to the donors and funders who believed in GHR and gave us all possible support and facilities especially the Ministries of Foreign Affairs of Switzerland and Norway. We have also received for the first time, financial support from the Foreign Ministry of Belgium. My deep sense of gratitude goes as well to all partners, bodies and individuals without whom our experience would not have been as rich as it is today. My thanks go in particular, to the Moroccan Universities: University of Moulay Ismail in Meknes, University of Shoab Dokkali in Eljadida and University of Cadi Ayyad in Marrakech. In Egypt, my thanks and appreciations

go to Cairo University, Beni Suef University and the Office of the International Committee of the Red Cross in Cairo. Special thanks also go to the staff of the Institute for their efforts throughout this year which was full of work and challenges. I hope to continue our work in the coming years to achieve our hopes and aspirations of tomorrow: the establishment human rights for all.

# I. Executive Summary

Since its establishment, GIHR has demonstrated a commitment towards the promotion and the dissemination of international human rights, acquainting concerned institutions with these principals. Indeed, different governmental and non governmental institutions and civil society organizations within the Arab region have expressed their need for a better understanding of International Human Rights instruments to be able to use them in their advocacy and implementation at the national and grassroots level.

In the Arab region, GIHR has been able to win the trust and confidence of several governmental institutions by providing them with technical support and expertise on training.

2011 has been a year of many activities and accomplishments, which has enabled Geneva Institute for Human Rights to proceed forwards in its work. GIHR dedicated staff and resource persons endeavoured to continue the momentum gained from the work accomplished in 2010, ensuring that knowledge and technical assistance on human rights issues reached as many beneficiaries as possible.

GIHR has worked in 9 countries: Syria, Switzerland, Morocco, Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan, Sudan, Libya and Tunisia. The work has been both inspiring and encouraging, as most organizations have commended our work and have provided the institute with the moral support and encouragement that we are providing them with technical information which has kept them updated with most International human rights principals and mechanisms including the Universal Periodic Review (UPR) and the work of the Human Rights Council (HRC).

For the first time, GIHR conducted work in two new countries, Libya and Tunisia, thus expanding our outreach to countries in the Middle East. The Institute has also concentrated on provision of technical assistance for reporting and monitoring the Universal Periodic Review.

This report provides details of the activities undertaken, the challenges faced and the achievements accomplished. All together the programme had some major challenges in particular given the effects of the global recession, which has affected most non-governmental organizations. Without the commitment

and financial support of the Swiss Ministry of Foreign Affairs, it might have been very difficult for the institute to conduct its activities. We were also able to get financial assistance for the first time from the Belgium Ministry of Foreign Affairs who kindly supported our work in Egypt.

GIHR would like to express its sincere appreciation to the Political Division IV Section for Human Rights Policy, Swiss Federal Department of Foreign Affairs, without whom this work and achievements would not have been possible.

## II. Introduction

### About GIHR

The Geneva Institute for Human Rights is a non-governmental, non – profit organization based in Geneva. Since its establishment in 2004, the Institute has provided Human Rights trainings in North Africa and the Middle East to human rights defenders and public institutions, empowering them to access and use International Human Rights procedures, standards and mechanisms. GIHR has also delivered capacity building and advocacy services to different governmental and non-governmental organizations that protect the rights of individuals with a special focus on women and children in the African and Arab Region.

The Institute is strategically based in Geneva where the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) is situated. Since its inception, the institute has gained a good reputation amongst International and regional bodies and UN agencies including the OHCHR, The UN Committee on the Rights of the Child (CRC), the UN Committee of the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), the Organization of the Islamic Cooperation (OIC), the Arab Organization for Human Rights (AOHR) in addition to other Non-governmental organizations in the Middle East North Africa region (MENA).

Throughout its endeavours, GIHR has gained experience as a technical agency that can strengthen the capacity of organizations and institutes in the African and Arab Regions on the different UN Human Rights instruments, in addition to being an institute that advocates and calls for reform on how the region views human rights, in particular women and child rights.

## Overview of Goal and Objectives for GIHR for 2011

The overall goal for GIHR for 2011 was “to build on the key achievements of GIHR and to continue its work in advancing knowledge on Human Rights principals in the Arab region reaching out to governmental and non - governmental institutions within societies.” It aims to achieve this overall goal through three specific objectives:

Objective 1: To build the capacity of governmental institutions and law enforcement agencies on Human Rights mechanisms and international conventions related to human rights.

Objective 2: To increase knowledge and skills for human rights defenders and organizations on using international human rights procedures, principally UN treaty monitoring bodies in the Arab region.

Objective 3: To increase knowledge and information on Women and Child rights.

## III. Activities Undertaken for 2011

### Overview:

2011 has been an eventful year for GIHR, in particular with the challenge of the global financial recession, which has threatened most organizations in being able to conduct their projects.

The activities which GIHR has undertaken for 2011 included organizing and conducting Thirty-four training courses in Syria, Switzerland, Morocco, Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan, Sudan, Libya and Tunisia; in addition to participating in different conferences.

GIHR has also participated and provided its expertise on training courses in Switzerland, Lebanon, Bahrain, Libya and Tunisia. In addition to its role in participating and attending in different UN sessions and meetings held in Geneva by the UN (see Annex I).

Drawing on the principals set by International UN instruments and frameworks, our first priority has been to familiarise and empower national governmental and non governmental organizations and institutions in the Arab region on these different UN mechanisms to enable them to use these mechanisms in their future work.

Some of the key highlights of our work in 2011 have included:

- Focusing on the provision of technical assistance for reporting on the UPR for Tunisian Government and Non - Governmental organizations and UN Country Team.
- Providing training, for the first time, for the civil society in Libya and Tunisia.
- Expanding our outreach to Libya and Tunisia.

## IV. Challenges Faced

Despite the numerous events and the successful outcomes of the work of the Institute, GIHR has faced several challenges for 2011, which included:

- A high demand for GIHR's participation in several events, which has led to being overstretched to the maximum.
- Minimal funding to the organization, which has provided difficulty in conducting all the activities which were set for 2011. This has in fact affected and reduced some of the major projects for the institute.
- Despite the poor availability of financial resources, GIHR felt that it was crucial to conduct some of the trainings in Sudan, where there was no contribution by the Sudanese Ministry of Interior respectively. This meant re-allocating some of GIHR's own funds to these activities which affected negatively the institute.

## V. Impact and Achievements

- GIHR has built a roster of experts, who have been able to attend and participate in the activities. For 2011, the expertise of 192 members of our resource person's roster participated in the trainings from different nationalities.
- GIHR has trained a total of 806 participants from 20 different countries, with the ratio of male to female being 500:306. These included 140 representatives from governmental institutions, 7 from national human rights institutions and 659 participants from NGOs and human rights defenders.
- GIHR has been supportive in the activities of the Human Rights Council; the Universal Periodic Review and the Treaty Monitoring Bodies.
- GIHR has been able to outreach countries where human rights were not openly acknowledged, as the case in Libya and Tunisia. The institute has won the trust and confidence of some of the major stakeholders in these countries.

## VI. Future Work

Despite the heavy workload and the diverse activities which were not always planned, GIHR was able to conduct and achieve several discussions despite being overstretched to the maximum with regard to both human and financial resources.
